The [University of Maryland, Baltimore \(UMB\) Recovery website](#) has been revamped with some new features.

One feature pins important information to the top of feeds on the website. It helps to quickly find updated information on requirements, mandates, and return to campus information that will continue to be updated this summer.

The Return to Campus guide has its own [webpage](#), too. This takes information from the PDF to create a web-friendly portal for information that students and employees need to know this summer. An updated PDF guide is in the works for June that includes comprehensive changes.

The [Campus Facilities, Cleaning, and Disinfecting page](#) has a revamped focus to include physical distancing, capacity, and other information about campus buildings in addition to the existing cleaning and disinfecting information.

Suggestion/question forms also have been consolidated. There is now a single form to [ask your question](#) about the Return to Campus, vaccines, or the Recovery website.

Vaccination Mandate Updates

Don't wait until it's too late: Plan ahead!

To meet the terms of the University System of Maryland (USM) COVID-19 vaccination mandate, UMB employees and students should plan to have your final dose — whether one-shot or two-shot — administered by **Aug. 2**. Target July 1 for the first dose.

Vaccine Available for 12 and Up

Children 12 years old and up can now receive a dose of the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine at the UMB Vaccination Clinic.

A parent or legal guardian must accompany anyone under age 18.

Walk-up slots are available Thursday through Saturday from 10:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. for:

UMB Face Coverings Policy Revised

Consistent with state of Maryland and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidance, UMB no longer requires masks and face coverings be worn outdoors with the following exception: Masks are still required for outdoor gatherings where attendees will be in fixed seating for more than 15 minutes and for which 6 feet of physical distancing cannot be sustained.

Also, while indoors, you do not need to wear a face covering if you are **alone** in an office, cubicle, laboratory, or study area. (A closed door is no longer required.)

URecFit and Wellness Reopening June 1

URecFit and Wellness is excited to announce its staged reopening plan over the next several weeks. URecFit and Wellness will reopen to current UMB students and UMB graduates of 2020 and 2021 on June 1.

Domestic Travel Policy Effective June 1

On June 1, UMB will permit the resumption of domestic business travel. UMB travelers must be fully vaccinated for COVID-19 in accordance with USM's vaccination policy and follow current CDC domestic travel guidance. Currently this requires domestic travelers who are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 to self-monitor for symptoms, wear a mask, and take other COVID-19 safety precautions.

If a UMB traveler has an approved medical or religious vaccination exemption, they must follow CDC guidance for nonvaccinated travelers. For more information, read the [updated policy](#).



Pop-Up Pantry Set for May 22



Share COVID Data in One Click

Faculty, staff, and students can share their COVID-19 tests and vaccination information in one click.

The [Chesapeake Regional Information System for our Patients \(CRISP\) waiver form](#) provides clinical and occupational health staff at UMB with this information, helping

CRISP shares information from other facilities within Maryland. Out-of-state testing results and vaccination information will likely still have to be entered in SAFE on Campus or the [UMB Vaccination Form](#).

University of Maryland School of Nursing students will continue to upload information into CastleBranch because the school needs immunization records in one place for clinical placement purposes.

On-Campus COVID-19 Testing Clinic Appointments

Appointments continue to be offered at the on-campus COVID-19 Testing Clinic through this [scheduling application](#).

However, the best option for faculty, staff, and students wanting to schedule an appointment for an on-campus COVID-19 diagnostic test or a flu shot is to call [UMaryland Immediate Care](#) directly at 667-214-1899.

The location of the test will depend on UMaryland Immediate Care's scheduling — either at the SMC Campus Center or the urgent care clinic at 408 W. Lombard St. Double-check your appointment online or call to confirm your testing location.

Additionally, the Baltimore Convention Center has a wider availability of appointments for testing and is a short walk from campus. Appointments at the Convention Center can be made online using [this link](#).
