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#### Apply Today for Immersive Faculty Development Program in Costa Rica

The UMB Center for Global Engagement is excited to offer an immersive faculty development program in Costa Rica for a select cohort of UMB faculty members to globalize their courses, modules, tracks, or clinical electives.

From January 4-8, 2023, UMB faculty members will engage in a series of interactive workshops on topics such as learning design and assessment, strategies to globalize curricula, ethical global engagement, incorporating active learning, inclusive classroom practice, and other topics. Participants must propose a global course, module, track, clinical elective, or international program that they will design in collaboration with skilled trainers during the workshop.

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## "Interprofessional Exploration of Health and Mental Health in India" Course Info Session

**August 30 at 5 p.m.**

In the 3 credit "Interprofessional Exploration of Health and Mental Health in India" course, students from social work, nursing, pharmacy, and public health will learn about health care practices in India. The travel portion of the course will take place January 5–15, 2023, and includes participation in an international conference and visits to health and social service agencies in India.

During the Fall, students will work virtually in teams with students from India to learn about health and mental health issues and care in India and prepare a conference presentation. Students earn 3 credits in the Spring semester but assignments span the Fall, Winter, and Spring semesters.

A grant from UMB's Center for Global Education Initiatives will cover the cost of conference attendance and most in-country travel expenses. Students will need to cover the cost of airfare which is estimated at \$1,500 and any immunizations that are needed.



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## Join a Discussion on Creating Equity and Accessibility in Rwanda through Prosthesis

Fogarty International Center and NICHD's National Center for Medical Rehabilitation Research for "**Research, Opportunity, and Healing: Creating Equity and Accessibility Can Change Lives for People with Disabilities in Rwanda**" Sept. 7 at noon.

Keynote speaker Claudine Humure designed a 3-D-printed, adjustable prosthetic socket for transfemoral amputees in developing countries. An amputee herself, Humure's goal is to start a prosthetic clinic in her home country Rwanda that will supply amputees who are not able to afford the costly prostheses on the market today.

She will discuss her journey from amputee to advocate and prosthesis designer as well as the future of prosthetics globally with Fogarty International Center Director, Roger I. Glass and NICHD National Center for Medical Rehabilitation Research Director, Theresa Cruz.
