### **Abstract:**

The Susan H. Hadary DVD Collection contains 50 DVDs of documentaries produced by Hadary. The documentaries tend to focus on medical topics such as the health and care of older people or those with disabilities, trauma medicine, mental health issues, and addiction. Other documentaries focus on youth in West Baltimore. The documentaries were produced for the University of Maryland School of Medicine, the Discovery Channel, Maryland Public Television, and HBO. The collection includes several documentaries which were nominated for Emmy and Academy Awards as well as winners of both prestigious prizes including *King Gimp*, *Grace*, and *Departing Rosewood*.

### **Biographical History:**

Susan Hannah Hadary is a documentary director. She has directed series for HBO, the Discovery Channel, and Maryland Public Television. Hadary has received an Oscar (Academy Award), national Emmy nominations, regional Emmy awards, and a Peabody Award for her work. She produced documentaries and series for MedSchool Maryland Productions for the University of Maryland School of Medicine.

### **Scope and Content:**

### **Series 1 – Seniors, 1984-2010**

This series includes DVDs documenting the lives of older men and women as they deal with health concerns and disabilities due to age. This series includes two documentaries on Alzheimer's, including, *Grace*, a regional Emmy-winning documentary. DVDs date from 1984 to 2010.

### **Series 2 – Stars of Inclusion, 1986-2013**

This series includes DVDs that document the lives of children with physical disabilities as they enter school. It shows the challenges they faced in these schools. This series includes the Oscar-winning documentary *King Gimp*, which follows Dan Keplinger. Keplinger has Cerebral Palsy; the film shows him graduating from college and becoming an artist. ### **Series 7 – Other Titles, 2000-2019**

The DVDs in this series are not part of a min-series and are instead one-off documentaries. Most follow individuals in and around Baltimore, MD. Some are sponsored by the University of Maryland, School of Medicine and feature patients from the school. Some aired on Maryland Public Television, the Discovery Channel, and HBO. The DVDs date from 2000 to 2019.

*Love, Josh, 2001*

This documentary aired on HBO in 2001. It follows a 15 year old as he deals with the loss of his father. *Love, Josh* was an Academy Award finalist.

*Dr. Garrett, 2003*

This documentary follows Mina Garrett a first generation college and medical school graduate. *Dr. Garrett* was an Academy Award finalist.

*Departing Rosewood, 2010*

This documentary follows two individuals transitioning from life in a residential facility for individuals with developmental disabilities. The Rosewood Center closed to residents during filming.

*Walter P. Carter: Champion for Change, 2013*

This documentary tells the story of Walter P. Carter, a Baltimore Civil Rights leader in the 1960s. The film was funded by the University of Maryland, School of Medicine, Department of Psychiatry and aired on Maryland Public Television.

*Understanding Joy, 2014*

This documentary follows Joy, a gambling addict and her struggles to beat the addiction and deal with the legal ramifications of her actions. This film aired on Maryland Public Television.

*Glenn's Gamble, 2019*

This documentary follows Glenn, a marine and gambling addict. It follows Glenn's road to recovery.
