## Introduction

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Welcome,

U.S. News & World Report is now collecting data for the upcoming 2023 - 2024 edition of Best Nursing Schools, tentatively scheduled to be initially made available to the public around March 2023.

The deadline to submit this questionnaire is January 17th, 2023. The rest of this page has further instructions for completing the questionnaire.

Please Note: This survey and rankings covers **residence-based and hybrid programs only**. U.S. News defines these as having any amount of *instructional* portions of the program(s) *offered* to students via in-person learning. Instructional means education (e.g. classes) that is not orientation, testing, support services, clinical labs, practicum, residencies and internships. Offered means students have at least the option, if not required, to receive that instruction in an in-person (e.g. campus) setting. U.S. News ranks dedicated online master's nursing programs separately in its [Best Online Nursing Programs](https://www.usnews.com/education/online-education/nursing)

If large changes are flagged, a text box has been added that should be used to explain the change. In the case of a large change, the survey will not submit without providing an explanation.
