The CVD is Recruiting Volunteers for the Influenza Transmission Research Study!

The Center for Vaccine Development and Global Health (CVD) is seeking healthy adults aged 18-59 for a flu transmission study designed to examine the person-to-person transmission of community-acquired influenza. If you have been diagnosed with laboratory-confirmed influenza infection and have had an onset of influenza-like symptoms (fever $\geq 100.2^{\circ}\text{F}$ and cough or sore throat) in the past 48 hours, you may qualify to participate.

The Institute of Human Virology (IHV) at UMSOM received an annual award for \$3 million funded by the NIH Office of AIDS Research.

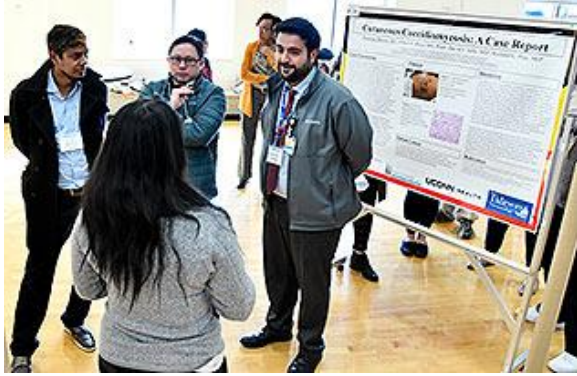
