

Update On The Value Of Standard Nursing Terminologies and the Need for Integration into Disruptive Environments Of Healthcare

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Abstract

In October 2022, the leaders of four of the leading terminologies, NANDA-I, NIC/NOC, CCC, and the Omaha System provided an update on their terminologies, and provided guidance on the needs for interoperability, moving into Disruptive Environments of Healthcare. In addition, international colleagues who use all these standard nursing terminologies (SNTs) in multiple environments demonstrated using SNTs to change national policy, outcomes, and quality. Another panel described what the disruptive environments are. A research panel described when SNTs are used, patient risks can be predicted, quality can be measured, and outcomes can be met. Yet another panel presented exemplars of Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) values currently measured using each SNT. There was so much evidence of the value of SNTs, audience participation will be solicited to determine what policies and research could integrate SNT's into more healthcare environments nationally to support care coordination and the care continuum across healthcare settings.
