Dear Doctor:

This is to acknowledge receipt of your letter of January 22, and to advise that there is no law in Illinois at the present time governing the practice of physical therapy as a profession.

The Illinois Medical Practice Act, copy of which is enclosed, governs the treatment of human ailments by any method or system and we refer you to sections checked in pencil which give the legal requirements for a license to practice the treatment of human ailments without the use of drugs or medicines and without operative surgery.

Sections 24 and 25 provide the penalty for conviction of practicing without a proper license.
