Dear Mrs. Harden:

This will refer to your letter of September 27, 1944, addressed to Mr. E. L. Wilshin, our Directory Advertising Manager, in connection with the listing of Chiropractors under the heading of Physiotherapists in the classified section of the Baltimore telephone directory.

On or about September 8 I called at the office of Dr. Joseph M. Roskopf at 512 Cathedral Street and reviewed with him and Dr. J. I. Becker and Dr. Gordon D. McLean the letter dated August 9 from the Maryland State Physical Therapy Society.

During the discussion I pointed out that the Telephone Company is not in a position to call upon its subscribers to present credentials entitling them to practice specific professions and thereby qualify for a listing under such headings in the telephone directory. As a result of our discussion it was agreed by all those present that the matter of policing the applicants for listings under specific headings in the directory was not a practical one from the standpoint of the Telephone Company. At the time it was agreed that any further discussion between the Chiropractors and the Physiotherapists regarding any alleged misrepresentation would be a matter that could be satisfactorily disposed of between the Maryland State Physical Therapy Society and the Chiropractors Association or Society.

I regret very much that it is not possible for us to take action of the nature to which you referred in your letter. Should there be any further questions concerning the matter after you have talked with the officers of the Maryland State Physical Therapy Society, I would be pleased if you would communicate with me.
