NEW DEPARTMENT

On Sept. 1, 1966, a third school for orthopedically handicapped children was opened in Balto. Co. Located on Rolling Road and named after the same, it is charged with the care of approximately 40 physically handicapped, as well as 150 mentally handicapped children. The wing for the mentally limited has been open for nine years. It's principle is Mrs. Grace Tucholka.

The school boasts new and fully equipped speech, occupational and physical therapy departments. The therapies are offered as an integral part of the regular daily program for these children. Heading the speech therapy dept. is Mrs. Kathy Hurley, a graduate of the Univ. of Mass., with her M.A. in speech therapy from Temple Univ. Miss Barbara Edwards, with an M.A. from Syracuse Univ., heads the Occupational Therapy Dept. The Physical Therapy Dept. is under the guidance of a Univ. of Md. graduate, Mrs. Jane Satterfield.

A statistical breakdown of the enrollment in the orthopedic wing (by diagnosis) includes: 22 cerebral palse; 6 muscular dystrophy, 4 congenital anomalies (including spina bifida, hy (cont. on next page)

cephalus, and severe heart malformations),  
one each of the following: ulcerative  
colitis, brain tumor, osteogenesis imperfecta,  
chondrodystrophia, dystonia muscularum de-  
formans.
