Dear Miss Anderson:

I want to apologize for talking so long to answer your letter. It was forwarded to me by Miss Byrd just before I went on vacation and I have not had a chance to answer it until now.

There seem to be two problems which we would like to have discussed at the Executive Committee Meeting:

1. The possibility of including men in the Bill which gives an Army rating to Physical Therapists.  
There are several men in our Chapter and they are all quite concerned about the exclusion of men in the Bill. They feel that veterans of this war, particularly those with eye injuries and those with a physical handicap, will have no incentive to go into Physical Therapy if men are ignored so completely.
2. State Registry  
Apparently several States have tried to set up a State Registry and all have met with approximately the same problems-Osteopathic and Chiropractic groups and insufficient backing from the Medical men in the State.

In regard to your second question:

We would prefer having a member of the Committee visit the Chapter after the Executive Meeting.

Although, we would like to send a representative no one feels that she can leave due to the scarcity of Physical Therapists in Maryland.
