## INTRODUCTION

For the last couple of years numerous members of this Chapter have questioned the advisability of their individual membership to the Registry of the American Congress of Physical Medicine. The present questionnaire was developed to determine the prevalence of this feeling among other Chapters and their members.

The impetus behind this questionnaire at this time is as follows:

On November 2, 1953, Florence and Robert Kendall received a letter from the Registry concerning the ethics of their present practice of physical therapy in the State of Maryland. In other words, revoking their membership in the Registry under the present ethical platform as stated in the Registry's booklet on "Ethics for the Physical Therapist". The Kendalls left Children's Hospital, Baltimore, Maryland, on \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ and had opened private offices in Baltimore. The Kendalla have at all times abided by the ethical conduct for good physical therapy practice as described in the Ethics of the Platform of the APTA. The Fendalls sent a letter to the Registry requesting more information concerning the action of the Registry and concerning the Ethics as described by the Registry. Please find enclosed the Kandalla letter to the Registry and also a brief summary of the Ethics for a Physical Therapist as described by the Registry.

This action by the Registry brought again to the front the questions:
"Why should we be members of the Registry?" "Do we subscribe to the Ethical
Platform as published by the Registry?" "Do we need to be qualified by their
National Examination?" "Do we need a registry of qualified physical therapist
with them"

In summary, the present feeling of this Chapter toward the functions of the Registry and toward our own national organizations are as follows:

- 1. Wonderment as to how the present "Ethics for a Physical Therapist" as described by the Registry was developed and how it would be possible to carry such a platform out in a realistic way today.
- 2. Wouldn't we all be practicing unethically under the platform of the Registry?
