Dear Miss Hilderbrandt:

Your letter of November 3rd to Miss Helen Coburn has been forwarded to me. It is true that in order to practice physical therapy, either privately or as a part of a hospital institution, one must have licensure in the State of Maryland. On December 6 of this year there is to be held in Baltimore the first examination for those requiring licenses for practice in the State of Maryland. An application may be had by writing Mr. Clemens W. Gaines, 2411 North Charles Street, Baltimore 18, who is Secretary of the State Board of Physical Therapy Examiners. He will send you an application blank which must be accompanied on its return by a transcript of your academic work which led to your graduation as a physical therapist. May I suggest that if you desire to take the examination December 6, at the same time you write Mr. Gaines that you write your own school for a transcript since time is so very short. As yet there has been no announcement with regard to the place of the examination.

I am sure that Mr. Gaines will give you all the pertinent information when you write him requesting an application blank.
