
Thank you for your letter titled "Notification of Editing Changes, NLN, Annual Survey of School of Nursing" in which you stated we had reported an August 1977 class size of 296 and asking us if we wished to change it to 308.

The response to your question is a definite "yes". For your record, the University of Maryland School of Nursing treats as an Admissions Cohort the students recorded in 2 different places on the October 15, 1977 Questionnaire to Baccalaureate Programs in Nursing. A review of our xerox copy of the 1977 questionnaire shows an error in 6e - August 1977 answer slot. It should read 296. The combination of the answers for 6a - June 1977 (12 students) and 6e - August (296 students) produces the total of 308 cohort members of the admissions class of 1977.

As you recently suggested, in the future we will asterick these figures and make a note about this cohort on the submitted questionnaire.
