Question: Page 2 (6 a,b,c,d.) Refers to Fall 1974 enrollment "who attended class". Students "admitted" may not necessarily ever enroll. The NLN uses the term admitted but really means those enrolled.

Question: Page 2 (6 e,f,g,h.) Refers to Fall 1975. We have never counted part-time students unless differentiated on the questionnaire as on page 4.

(6 h) In line with the above, our RN enrollment (full-time) isn't 132. Also refer to page 4 (9b) where you note 100 RN full-time?

Answer: (6 e,f,g,h.) "Comment noted."

(6 h) Based on your comments, I have subtracted the part-time (out research), the 1 returnee, 3 RN generic students, and 3 withdraws to give a total of 100. This now coincides with page 4 (9b).

Question: Page 3 (8) Graduations 525 (State Board report as of Fall 1975 says 511). May not matter.

(8 a,b,c,d.) These do not add up to a total of 525 (per directions).

(8 a) We formerly counted WRAIN as transfers but since all are admitted as juniors to UMAB this figure should be all except RN's and any (few) who entered in the 8d category. It isn't too difficult to reep a tabulation of those (of our students who drop-out and return since we have to save spaces for them in calculating spaces in a class- the others in the 8d category would be rare transfers from another program who could fit into our upper division). One "without interruption" phrase under 8 is the key.
