Curt Civin, MD, Professor, Departments of Pediatrics & Physiology; Associate Dean for Research; and Director, Center for Stem Cell Biology & Regenerative Medicine, and **Tami Kingsbury**, PhD, Assistant Professor, Department of Physiology and Center for Stem Cell Biology & Regenerative Medicine, received a \$100,000 award from Maryland Industrial Partnerships (MIPS) for “TheraCord Cord Blood Collection Device.” Dr. Civin and the Center were also awarded \$600,000 from a \$2 million Phase II R41 STTR grant from NIH and the National Cancer Institute for “Microfluidic Processing of Leukocytes for Molecular Diagnostic Testing.” They share this grant with Princeton University and GPB Scientific, LLC researchers. Dr. Civin and John Fisher, PhD, Professor and Associate Chair of Bioengineering, UMCP, have been awarded a multiple principal investigator \$655,000 Investigator-Initiated grant from the Maryland Stem Cell Research Fund/TEDCO for “Expansion of HSCs In a 3D Printed Bioreactor Containing MSCs as a Hematopoietic Microenvironment.”
