The problem with US website for collecting adverse events after vaccination is resolved

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The connectivity problem I described for the website of the US government Vaccine Adverse Event Reporting System (VAERS)¹ was resolved sometime between 11 June 2017² and 25 June 2017.³

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Food and Drug Administration, which cosponsor VAERS, also launched a new VAERS website, VAERS 2.0. The address of the new website is the same as the old: www.vaers.hhs.gov.
