## 3 areas of consideration

- Treatment access, quality, and scope of services
- Care for mother versus protection of fetus, infant, child
  - Medication-assisted treatment, criminalization and other risks of treatment-seeking
- Coordination of training, and services among systems
  - For example, among SUD treatment and child welfare systems
