Have you decided whether you
will return to the States on
leave or not? In conversation
with Mrs. Carroll, prior to your
attack of yellow fever, she said
that if you had to return to
Cuba, she would rather that
you would stay till Christmas
then come home for good.
In other words, she didn't like
the idea of your returning
after you once got home.
I shall come down about
the 15th of Oct, and perhaps may
still find you ~~there~~ at Columbia
Barracks. I hope to see you either
there or in Washington before I
sail. I think that we can all
get back home by Dec. 20th That
is my present expectation - How does
it feel to be an "immune"?
