SCAVENGER HUNT

Make sure to use the hashtag #umsophomecoming on your pictures as well as your team name.

It doesn't matter if you are a freshly minted P1, an experienced P3, or alumni of the School, you have probably spent a good deal of time here honing your abilities to be a good pharmacist. *Visit this lab, test your abilities, and take a picture with the instructor.*

Through its 138-year history, this beautiful building has been a courthouse, a jail, and a refuge for orphaned children. Now it serves as the headquarters for UMB's Department of Public Safety. *Take a picture in front of the building.*

One of the earliest Baltimore row houses, it was home to wealthy merchants and politicians. Now it houses some sleepless pharmacy students. *Take a picture at the site's historical marker.*

"Though thy crest be shorn and shaven, thou," I said, "art sure no craven, Ghastly grim and ancient Raven wandering from the Nightly shore— Tell me what thy lordly name is on the Night's Plutonian shore!" Quoth the Raven "Nevermore." This famous author is buried here. *Take a picture with the author's headstone. One point extra if you can find his second grave marker and take a picture.*

This 100-year old theater started as a stage for vaudeville performances and a movie theater. Now, it is Baltimore's home for Broadway shows. *Take a picture with the historic theater's signage.*

My cousin across the Atlantic might be little bit taller, but my clock is bigger and just seeing me will sooth your stomach. *Take a picture in front of the building.*

The great bambino lived at this site which is now home of one of the most beautiful baseball stadiums in the country. *Take a picture of one of your teammates with the same pose at this slugger's statue.*

Started in 1823, this teaching hospital would soon develop into the University of Maryland Medical Center. Now the site is home to more than 300,000 printed volumes and even a 3D printer. *Take a picture with the plaque that recognizes the site on the one of the pillars.*

When built in 1812, this building was on the outskirts of the city with an unobstructed view of the Patapsco River. The building is one of the oldest still used for medical education. *Take a picture with the historical marker on the site.*

In our first president's defense, 18th century toothpaste did consist of burnt bread. You can find one of his replacement chompers here on campus. *Take a picture with his artificial teeth.*

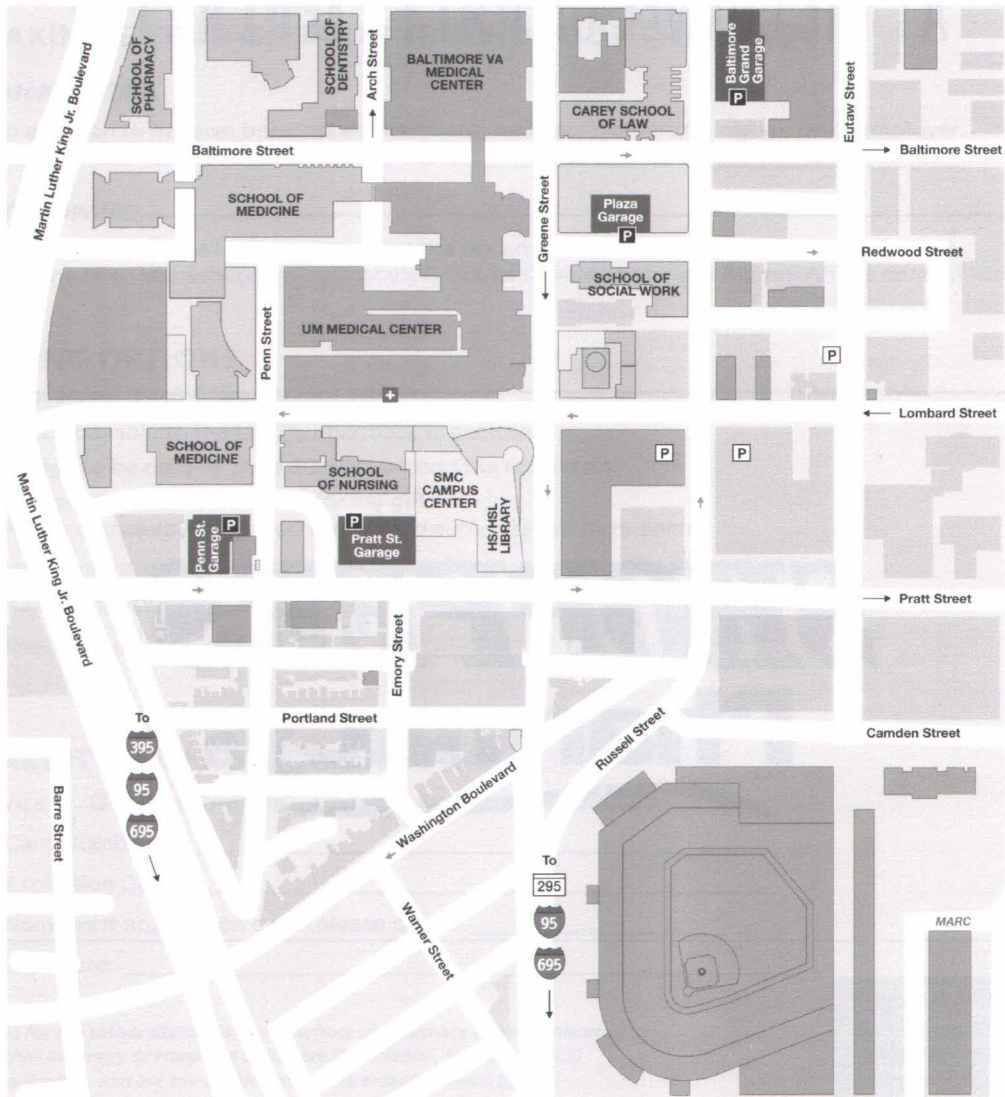
What started out as a two-bed unit turned into the world's first facility focused on treating patients within their golden hour. *Take a picture with the sign of the new entrance.*

Though the author of “Defense of Fort McHenry” is now resting in Frederick, Md., his original burial site is much closer to campus. Record and post a video of your team singing part of the National Anthem near the plaque.

The first college of its kind, it has been unsuccessfully trying to get many of us to floss since March 6, 1840. Take a picture at the historical marker.

There is a place within the School of Pharmacy that contains a degree from one of the founders of Merck, Sharp, and Dome. Take a picture in front of it.
